### *Rules & Regulations for Barn, Arena, Trails & Field*

#### **BARN:**

All areas must be swept, including the inside of the stalls; any rakes, brooms, and wheelbarrows used must be stored inside the barn along the middle corridor on the wall. Hoses must be wrapped around the tire areas in the front of the barn.

#### **ARENAS:**

**Horses cannot be stalled or fed inside any of the arenas.** There are portable stalls behind the back fence that are easily erected to form large configurations for horses that will not use barn stalls. All manure must be removed from the areas after any use. **\*\* Manure is to be disposed of in the designated area in the rear of the Barn. Removal will occur between 10 and 11 am by Panhandle staff during horse activity at the barn.**

#### **TRAILS:**

When marking trails it is preferred that color ribbons are used and attached with clothes pins to make it easier to remove. **All ribbons must be removed from the trail after use.**

#### **OPEN AREAS:**

This refers to all surrounding areas (fields included) that are adjacent to the barn, the lower area where vehicles park. **All manure must be picked up and disposed of properly (see above).**

**\*\*Manure left in the arenas composts into the sand, creating a powder of dust that is harmful to horses and humans. If manure is allowed to constantly mulch into the sand it turns into a sludgy mud that is dangerous to ride on. Panhandle 4-H is adopting the National Forests' "Leave no Trace" rule for protection of open public lands.**

*Failure to comply with these rules will result in forfeiture of deposit.*
